***Calendaring Guidelines and Policies***

**FELONY CASES**

**Execution of Sentence Suspended (ESS) – Violation of Probation:**

- Set in appropriate felony alpha department unless the sentencing judge has requested to retain the case. In that situation, the case will be clearly marked on the front of the case file to indicate it is to remain with the sentencing judge.

**Arrest/bench warrants and probation violations:**

- Assign to the appropriate felony alpha department unless the previous judge has requested to retain the case. In that situation, the case will be clearly marked on the front of the file to indicate it is to remain with the previous judge.

**Jury Trials from Non-Trial Departments:**

- **Dept. 9:** If a case cannot be resolved at Pre Trial, matter to be set in Dept. 1, Monday through Friday, at 1:30 for assignment to a trial department.
- **Dept 18:** If a case is not resolved at the Jury Trial Calendar Call, attorneys are to report to Dept. 1, Friday, at 3:00 p.m. for assignment to a trial department.

**DRUG CASES**

**District Attorney's Office identifies Drug cases when filing:**

- Felony drug cases that are presumptively eligible for treatment are assigned to Department 9.
- Felony drug cases that are presumptively ineligible for treatment (i.e., H&S 11351, 11351.5, 11352 sales, 11359, 11370.1, 11378, 11379, 11379.6) are assigned to the appropriate felony alpha department.
- Misdemeanor drug cases are assigned to the appropriate misdemeanor alpha department. If found eligible, case to be set for the DEJ Review calendar.

**DOMESTIC VIOLENCE CASES**

**District Attorney's Office identifies Domestic Violence cases when filing:**

- All felony cases are assigned to Department 10.
- All misdemeanors cases are assigned to Department 6.

**JUVENILE DELINQUENCY CASES**

- All Juvenile Delinquency jurisdictional hearings with a time estimate of 4 hours or longer will be assigned by the Presiding Judge to an available department.

**ALL CASE TYPES**

- To the greatest extent possible, Judges are not to set cases when they are scheduled to be off.
- Misdemeanor cases will follow open felony charges.
